## COVID-19 restart and in person activities

2020/21 proved to be another year where we have all faced multiple challenge due to the impact of COVID-19. We ended up having to suspend in person meetings until April 2021 due to a rollercoaster of Lockdowns and the need to find ways to reopen the group in a safe way and at the right time. We continued to explore ways to provide an alternative offering, including virtual meetings, focusing on providing regular updates from sections with activities, opportunities to earn badges and take part in National Scouting initiatives. The hard work of the group means we now have:

- An up to date, and continually updated, risk assessment in relation to COVID-19 to enable us to meet in person and resume activities since April 2021
- Updated Hall protocols and procedures to ensure we are COVID-19 secure
- More funds from the Council to support our Group and the Hall during lockdown, which we have invested in hall maintenance such as new fire doors, outdoor shelters to enable more outdoor activities and a suspension of subs while we were unable to offer a full range of activities.
